Electric shocks and burns	All	All equipment is visually inspected at the start of each day of workshops, to check for signs of damage. Any damaged equipment is not used until repaired or replaced.				
		Equipment used by students & staff is all low-voltage (Class 3 appliances) to remove risk of mains electricity shock.
