Slips, trips, entanglement	All	<p>Equipment used by students & staff is battery-operated to eliminate need for trailing mains power cables around the classroom.</p> <p>USB Cables on the students’ equipment are kept as short as possible and will disconnect if pulled with force.</p> <p>Students and staff advised to take care walking around the classroom carrying the battery operated equipment and not to run.</p> <p>Equipment for use by employees is setup away from the students’ desks, typically at a teacher’s desk. Laptop cables are run out of reach of students & staff and temporarily secured with tape if necessary, to prevent them being a trip hazard.</p>	None			
Electric shocks and burns	All	<p>All equipment is visually inspected at the start of each day of workshops, to check for signs of damage. Any damaged equipment is not used until repaired or replaced.</p> <p>Equipment used by students & staff is all low-voltage (Class 3 appliances) to remove risk of mains electricity shock.</p> <p>Equipment is enclosed in protective cases which prevents access to any</p>	None			

		<p>hot electronic components inside.</p> <p>Electrical equipment used by employees are all Class 2 appliances (e.g. laptops) and are PAT tested every four years, as per recommendations for school environments.</p>	Organise PAT Testing	Nicholas Nurock	June 2029	
Injury from lifting heavy equipment	All	<p>Staff and students are not permitted to lift equipment other than that placed out on desks by employees.</p> <p>Employees to use wheeled cases for transporting heavy equipment and not to overload cases or bags beyond their lifting capabilities</p>	None
